Payment Methods

The 2023 Parent Payments for South Yarra Primary School can be accessed on Compass via the 'Payment Centre' on the Web Browser and App.

We would request for families to select your payment option in the Compass parent portal by Monday 27 February 2023, so the school can budget accordingly to provide additional provisions and resources for students. Your financial contributions ensure the high community expectation of the school can be met and continued high levels of achievement are attained.

The following payment options are available to families choosing to contribute to the school:

Option 1 Lump sum payment of contribution requested by Monday 27 February 2023.

Option 2 A flexible contribution option is available through Compass for families via 4 instalments throughout the year, 1 per school term.

South Yarra Primary School also continues to welcome your additional voluntary contributions throughout 2023.

Your support of your child's education is greatly appreciated and will enable South Yarra Primary School to continue to be at the forefront of educational provision.

Refunds

Parent requests for refunds are subject to the discretion of the school and made on a case-by-case basis.

If Extra-Curricular Items and Activities, Excursion or Camp have been paid for which is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances e.g., snap lockdown, families will receive a credit on their account for the total paid. Family credits will be put towards any future events/camps, including those happening the following year. Where an event is missed credits are worked out on a case-by-case basis. Upon a family's exit from the school, they will be personally contacted to discuss any credits they may have on their account.

Refunds are worked out on a case-by-case basis and will be provided where the school deems it is reasonable and fair to do so, taking into consideration whether a cost has been incurred by the school, the Department's Parent Payment Policy and Guidance, Financial Help for Families Policy, and any other relevant information.

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:



Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

• Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g., textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

 Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
