Payment Methods

The 2026 Parent Payments for South Yarra Primary School can be accessed on Compass via the 'Payment Centre' on the Web Browser and App.

We would request that families select their payment option in the Compass parent portal by Monday, 2 March 2026, so the school can budget accordingly to provide additional provisions and resources for students. Your financial contributions ensure that the high community expectations of the school can be met and continued high levels of achievement are attained.

The following payment options are available to families choosing to contribute to the school:

Option 1: Lump sum payment of contribution requested by Monday 2 March 2026.

Option 2: A flexible contribution option is available through Compass for families via 4 instalments throughout the year, 1 per school term. To be set up by Monday, 2 March 2026.

South Yarra Primary School also continues to welcome your additional voluntary contributions throughout 2026.

Your support of your child's education is greatly appreciated and will enable South Yarra Primary School to continue to be at the forefront of educational provision.

Refunds

Parent requests for refunds are subject to the discretion of the school and are made on a case-by-case basis.

If Extra-Curricular Items and Activities, Excursions or Camps have been paid for and are cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, families will receive a credit on their account for the total paid. Family credits will be put towards any future events/camps, including those happening the following year. Where an event is missed, credits are worked out on a case-by-case basis. Upon a family's exit from the school, they will be personally contacted to discuss any credits they may have on their account.

Refunds are worked out on a case-by-case basis and will be provided where the school deems it is reasonable and fair to do so, taking into consideration whether a cost has been incurred by the school, the Department's Parent Payment Policy and Guidance, Financial Help for Families Policy, and any other relevant information.

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the requirements of the Curriculum. This includes the Victorian Curriculum F-10, the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) including the VCE Vocational Major and the Victorian Pathways Certificate.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
